RECYCLING INFORMATION

Deptford Township has a robust recycling program. We'd like to use this space to address some frequently asked questions from our residents, to clear up any misconceptions and ensure we're getting the maximum benefit from recycling.

Deptford uses single stream recycling, meaning containers (bottles, cans, etc.) are commingled with paper (newspaper, cardboard, etc.). However—not ALL paper, plastic and metal is eligible to be recycled. Any non-recyclable material will contaminate a batch and cause a number of problems, so remember: "When in doubt, throw it out!"

MATERIAL THAT MUST BE RECYCLED

Corrugated Cardboard

Large cardboard boxes must be cut down or flattened in order to be placed in tote.

Newspaper

Newsprint (including the advertisements found in newspapers)

Mixed Paper

Mail, magazines, office and colored paper; regular and window envelopes; receipts; glossy inserts; telephone books; chipboard and paperback books; greeting cards; brown craft paper bags; and non-metallic wrapping paper

Glass Bottles & Jars

Clear, green and brown bottles and jars. Rinse out bottles and jars and place in tote.

Aluminum, Steel & Tin Cans

Beverage and food cans. Rinse cans and place in tote.

Plastic Containers Only

Beverage and laundry containers with #1 PET and #2 HDPE symbols (located on the bottom or side of the container). Rinse out containers.

Mixed Paper/Cardboard/Chipboard etc.

All Cardboard and Chipboard MUST BE RECYCLED. Large Cardboard boxes need to be broken down so that they can be collected.

Here are some examples of accepted materials: Newspaper, junk mail, office type paper, corrugated cardboard, cereal boxes, etc.



MATERIAL THAT CANNOT BE RECYCLED

Items that will NOT be recycled under this program include toys, plastic bags, bubble wrap, ovenware, ceramic and polystyrene cups and plates, styrofoam, pots and pans, baking pans, drinking glasses, mirrors, automobile windshields, light bulbs, window glass, wax coated boxes, pizza boxes, 6-pack beverage holders, flower pots, plastic bags, comforters, pillows, rugs and all other miscellaneous plastics. All these items must be placed in household trash.

Recycling Toters Regulations:

- Place the Toter at curbside no earlier than 6pm the night before your scheduled pick up and no later than 6AM on the day of your scheduled pickup.
- The Toters must be placed no further than 3 feet from the edge of the street with the wheels facing your house and the front of the Toter facing the street.
- Toters must not be placed behind cars, mailboxes, telephone poles or any obstruction that will make it difficult for the operator to pick it up.
- These Toters are meant for recycling services only.
- Recycling should include: Cans/ Bottles/ Plastics/ Cardboard/ Paper products.
- Cut up large pieces of cardboard so they will fit inside the container easily.
- Do not jam large pieces of cardboard inside the Tote, this could stop the Tote from emptying when dumped into the truck.
- Do not place inside the Toter: Trash, Grass, Wood, Dirt, Paint cans, Hazardous chemicals Styrofoam, vinyl or any other materials that are not part of the Deptford Township's Recycling Program.
- All recycling must be placed inside the Toter for collection. If you have excessive amounts of cardboard you must flatten, bundle and place at the curb for Monday pickup. Residents need to call the Public Works Department to have a work order placed for pickup. If you have any questions please call 856-228-4719 between 7:00am 3:30pm.



Every January, we celebrate the first manned flight in the Americas, which occurred on January 9, 1793 when Jean-Pierre Blanchard piloted a hot air balloon from 6th & Walnut Streets in Philadelphia to Deptford, landing near Big Timber Creek. We commemorate this historic event with our "Come Fly with Us" awards ceremony, where Deptford students receive recognition for their drawings and essays describing their understanding of this event and its significance.





Deptford Township needs your help to efficiently remove snow and ice from our roadways. When snowy/ icy conditions are expected, we need all vehicles and trailers off the streets to allow us to plow curb-to-curb. Please observe the following points to help us keep our 500+ roads safe:

- Main roadways (those carrying the most traffic) are given first priority for salting and plowing. During a heavy snowfall, concentration is placed on the main roads until they are cleared, at which time secondary roads are attended to. Cul-de-sacs (circles or courts) are the last to be serviced.
- The snow that is in front of a plow will unload whenever it passes a clear area. Providing a clear area on the side of the driveway where the plow will be traveling will allow the snow to unload in the clearing before your driveway instead of in your driveway.
- Cul-de-sacs are difficult and timeconsuming to plow. Public Works prefers to push the snow off the road, leaving cul-de-sacs free of snow piles which could melt and cause icy spots. This greatly reduces hazardous conditions and prevents potholes from forming.
- Cars parked on the street become a major problem during inclement winter weather. As the plow goes around a parked vehicle, it leaves a pile of snow on the roadway. To avoid this, please remove vehicles from the street during snowstorms, in accordance with Township Ordinance.
- Public Works trucks plow as close to the curb-line as possible. This creates a wider roadway for traveling and parking. During heavier snowfalls, there are times when snow may get pushed into already cleared driveways and sidewalks. Please do not throw snow into the street from your sidewalk and driveway.
- Please avoid driving when it is not absolutely necessary during snow plowing operations. Snow plowing, a routine function, becomes much more difficult with parked, stalled, or stuck cars in the street.

We proudly honor our great country, our freedoms, and those who sacrificed their lives in defense of these rights. We invite you to show your patriotism and join us in displaying the flag every day. We thank all our veterans and current service members for their service and sacrifices. We are especially proud of, and grateful for, our own hometown heroes for answering this call.

Remember that only the President of the United States or State Governor can order the flag to be lowered to half staff. For flags which are no longer in suitable condition to be flown, do not disrespect this symbol of our nation by throwing

it in the trash-there is an American Flag disposal bin in the main lobby of the Deptford Municipal Building (1011 Cooper Street). When this box is full, an organization such as the American Legion, Veterans of Foreign Wars, Girl Scouts or Boy Scouts will collect the flags and retire them properly and respectfully.
