WHAT'S NEW AROUND TOWN

RED-LIGHT RUNNING AUTOMATED ENFORCEMENT PROGRAM

American Traffic Solutions has been selected to implement the red-light camera program in Deptford Township, New Jersey following the New Jersey Department of Transportation's approval for the program to proceed.

"Red-light running incidents continue to climb and the cameras used in the Red-Light Running Automated Enforcement Program will help make Deptford Township streets safer," said Mayor Paul Medany. "Red-light cameras are an important and proven tool in improving public safety by increasing awareness of traffic safety, thus decreasing the number of violations, crashes and injuries."

In the fall of 2008, Mayor and Council of Deptford Township signed a resolution to apply to participate in a five-year pilot with the New Jersey Department of Transportation Red-Light Running Automated Enforcement Program. The resolution that passed, selected American Traffic Solutions, Inc. (ATS) to run the Township's red-light photo-enforcement program upon state approval of the Township's application. The cameras will be installed at the intersection of Hurffville Road and Deptford Center Road.

Deptford Township is a throughway for major transportation routes in and around the Township, including State highways and several County roads.

ATS serves more than 140 communities with photo-enforcement programs including in New York City, Philadelphia and Washington DC.

THE GREENER SIDE OF THINGS

... BACK BY POPULAR DEMAND ...

Did you know that you can directly lower costs and; therefore, help control our property taxes with some of these GREEN actions:

- Recycle faithfully. Keep recyclable materials out of the trash stream and reduce disposal fees.
- ♦ Save money and time. Cut it and leave it. Save 20–25% of your time because you won't have to stop and empty the lawnmower bag. You'll also avoid purchasing yard waste bags and hauling them to the curb. You'll need to fertilize less since clippings return nutrients to the soil.
- Don't fertilize too much. For a healthier lawn, fertilize only twice per year—September and November, using a "slow release" fertilizer.
- Use the right amount of water.
 Water lawn in the early morning.
 This prevents evaporation. Only

water your lawn once or twice per week.

- Mow correctly. For a healthier looking lawn, mow frequently and only remove 1/3 of the lawn height. Most lawns in NJ should be 2 1/2" to 3 1/2" high. This will increase shade to the soil and keep the roots cool while blocking weed growth.
- Consider mulching your grass clippings. There
 is a considerable yearly fee for disposal and collection of yard waste. By mulching lawn clippings we can save money while being environmentally friendly.

THINK SAFETY REMINDER !!!

Effective April 1, 2006, permits are now required for the soft wall (storable) type pools as follows:

If the pool is capable of holding twenty-four or more inches or water, a Zoning Permit will be required for each year. A Building Permit will also be required for the installation of a permanent barrier that the Building Code mandates. An electrical permit will NOT be required as long as there is a GFCI receptacle within twenty-five feet of the pool.

Zoning Permits are

<u>REQUIRED</u> annually.

Please note <u>NO</u> pools will be grandfathered.



A Message from Our Mayor

Welcome to our newsletter. Please take a moment in your spare time to visit our website at www.deptford-nj.org to familiarize yourself with the services available via the website. During your visit, sign-up for email updates. The invaluable updates provide the most up-to-date information regarding meeting cancelations, road problems, snow emergencies and upcoming events.

Even though the economy remains unstable, the Township continues to reduce costs by shared services with Gloucester County, the Board of Education and MUA. The Township has balanced the budget by eliminating positions through attrition, not by layoffs. We continue to seek grants to offset costs for projects around the Township. The community service program is another example of our cost saving measures. The program is

underway and made possible through the cooperative efforts of the Municipal Court and the Department of Parks and Recreation. This program allows the Township Judge to assign defendants community service hours that must be performed within the Township. The workforce is utilized on Wednesdays and Saturdays, cleaning parks, performing maintenance at sports complexes, and roadside litter patrol throughout the Township.

Municipalities are continuously under tight budget restraints. Many mandates are forced onto municipalities with very limited or no funding at all. Some of the mandates include COAH (Council on Affordable Housing) and Stormwater Management Program.

Mayor and Council have been actively working with the United

States Postal Service to streamline our zip codes into one zip code and one municipal designation—Deptford Township. Currently, Deptford Township utilizes six zip codes that include various municipal designations. However, as of this newsletter, no progress has been made.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank everyone who made the 1st Annual Mayor's Wellness 5K Run/Walk a success. The event, held on April 25, 2009, raised over \$3,900.00 for the March of Dimes.

CONSTRUCTION DEPARTMENT

REMINDER—Be aware of common code offenses.

Please review the information below to help you minimize the risk of being in violation.

Grass/Weeds—All premises and exterior property shall be maintained free from grass or weeds in excess of 10 inches

Unregistered/Junk Vehicles—Only one unregistered or uninspected vehicle is allowed on your property and may not be parked in the street

Sanitation—Accumulations of rubbish and/or garbage is prohibited

Sidewalks/Driveways—All sidewalk and driveway areas shall be maintained in good condition and free of hazards

Defacement of Property—It shall be the responsibility of the owner to maintain a clean appearance on all surfaces

Vacant Structures and Land—All vacant structures and premises thereof shall be maintained in a clean, safe, secure and sanitary condition as not to cause a blighting problem or adversely affect the public health or safety

SINGLE STREAM RECYCLING REMINDER

Single stream (also known as fully commingled) recycling refers to a system in which all paper fibers and containers are mixed together into one container instead of being sorted in separate commodities (newspaper, cardboard, plastic, glass, etc.) by the resident and handled separately throughout the collection process. In single stream, the resident can now place all recycling material into the same container.

IMPORTANT CARDBOARD REMINDER

Any resident having excessive cardboard recycling can call the Public Works Department at (856) 228-4719 between the hours of 7:00AM—3:00PM to request a work order for a Friday curbside pick-up. The cardboard must be flattened and bundled and placed at the curb.

YARD WASTE PROGRAM

Deptford Township's yard waste is a year-round program, residents can place their grass clipping, sticks, twigs, small bundles of branches and garden clippings in a container no larger than 30 gallons and cannot exceed 50 lbs. in weight.

NOTES:

- Dirt, rocks, sod, and pet waste will **not** be accepted in these containers.
- Yard waste placed in plastic bags will **not** be accepted.
- Yard waste will be picked up following your regular trash collection day.

"NO NET LOSS REFORESTATION" GRANT—UPDATE



As part of the recently-awarded No Net Loss Reforestation Grant, Deptford Township has selected Exley's Landscape Service, Inc. to complete the project. Exley's has finished the first planting of 100 trees at the Recreation Complex. The trees have been planted so make sure you look for them the next time you are at the Recreation Complex!

When reforestation cannot be accomplished onsite, the No Net Loss law allows the State entity the option of paying monies into the State's "Treasure our Trees License Plate Fund" for the purpose of funding offsite reforestation. The Department of Trans-

portation, as a part of the No Net Less Reforestation Grant initiative, has deposited funds in the sum of \$110,100 to pay for the compensatory reforestation. These funds will be used to plant a total of 367 trees over the next three years. The Township's goal is to utilize this project as a tool to increase the beautification of the community. The project timeline will begin in Spring, 2009 and continue through Fall, 2012.
